KEYNOTE SPEAKER: RICHARD CABRAL

A former gang member, Richard fought a life sentence in prison and has since dedicated himself to helping others. He tells a compelling story of human transformation, redemption and recovery.

Nominated for a 2015 Emmy Award for his riveting portrayal of Hector Tontz in ABC's anthology series, American Crime, Richard was discovered by producers while working as a baker at Homeboy Industries. With memorable roles in movies such as The Counselor, A Better Life, End of Watch, Rampart and Snitch, he has also starred in the Lethal Weapon series on FOX and guest starred on ABC's Body of Proof, HBO's Luck and can be seen on the 2/9/23 episode of Law & Order SVU. Richard has a starring role in Mayans MC, the spin-off series to Sons of Anarchy on FX.



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SHAPE

What is SHAPE?

SHAPE is an immediate re-entry model of services for those who have been incarcerated as well as those who are otherwise Criminal Justice (CJ) involved through Diversion Courts, Probation, etc. Most outpatient clinics and health home programs throughout the community have some clients who have been or are presently criminal justice involved on some level. What sets Project SHAPE apart from these programs is that the targeted audience for the program is exclusively those who have a criminal justice history.



The track will offer outpatient treatment and Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) for those who have a history or on-going issue with Substance Use Disorder (SUD), mental health services for those with co-occurring disorders, health care management support to assist with the coordination of appropriate housing for those re-entering and/or requiring re-placement to assist with their goals related to Probation, Court, etc. as well as the monitoring of successful relocation once settled.

Huther Doyle employs staff with lived experience as well as those with many years of on-the-job experience working with those who have been justice involved.

Mobile Treatment Unit

Our mobile treatment unit is very busy out in the community helping those struggling and those that may not be able to make it to Huther Doyle or to an emergency room. We have an amazing Harm Reduction Team who is out there on the front lines every day doing this great work, providing Narcan, wound care, substance abuse evaluations, connecting people with the services they need and saving lives!



Health Homes

Not everyone knows that, in addition to our Substance Use Disorder Treatment and work in the community, we are also a Lead Health Home. We are the Lead Health Home in the Finger Lakes Region under HHUNY.

What is a Health Home, you ask? It sounds like a place but it's not. It is it's an extensive network of support for Medicaid recipients in the community. Our Health Home Care Managers coordinate all the services a person needs to stay healthy and out of the hospital or emergency room.

Each edition will feature a member of our staff team and I am kicking off this section by sharing a bit about myself with you. So, to begin, I am privileged to be the President and CEO of Huther Doyle, a position I have held since August of 2016. To say that I love my work is a significant understatement. In fact, I'm not sure there is a single word that could capture all the feelings I have about this job and about all that Huther Doyle represents. It is a small but mighty place that puts people and the community first, above all else. As our tagline aptly says, we are where hope lives, healing begins, and everything is possible.

That saying coincidentally sums up my life as well. I am the youngest of 6 children born into a big, bold, brash Irish American family. These carried throughout the generations and are ever present now. That is what makes Huther Doyle so very special to me.



Compared to our colleagues, we are small organization with a modest budget. Nonetheless, the collective love we share for the work we do and the deep loyalty we have for each other, and our consumers is enormous. It is what makes us stand out in a crowd. It is what George Huther and Greg Doyle envisioned when they founded Huther Doyle. It is the fabric of our existence.
